Sermon Series: Let's Go! Adventuring Through Acts

In the final message of our series on the book of Acts, Conejo's own Haylie Douglas will be sharing a message titled "Thank God and Take Courage." In Luke 27-28, Paul was in the midst of trials, both figuratively and literally. In the face of these trials, Paul continued to proclaim the kingdom of God and teach about the Lord Jesus Christ. Some believed that Paul was telling them the truth, but others would not believe. They had dull hearts, deaf ears, and shut eyes. But Paul spoke to them anyway, seeing his circumstances as an opportunity for the gospel.

Paul took his unforgiving situation and used it to advance the gospel. We don't know what happened with each of those seeds planted, and we don't even get the rest of the story on what happened for Paul. But we know that Paul continued in his call. The end of Paul's story is not the point – the point is that there is not an end to God's story. Because of people like Paul continuing to proclaim the Word of God in the middle of trials, we are able to bear witness to the triumphant nature of Christianity.

We are able to take the good with the bad, the triumph with the trials, because of what God has done for us. This text is a wonderful source of encouragement to all Christians that God will use our "chains" for the sake of His kingdom.

Fall Adult Bible Classes

Our auditorium class is exploring "The Spirit Shaped Life," a scripture-based class about our life in the Holy Spirit. Today, Daniel Overton will be teaching about spiritual gifts from Ephesians 4 and 1 Peter 4.

Our class in the north overflow room is currently studying "Work as Worship Bible Study," by J.D. Greear. This is a six-part Bible study that will challenge all of us to consider the reason God calls us to work. God gives us great potential for impact on our families, churches, communities, and the world through the blessing of our work.
