Looking Out for Mom's Needs

In a survey conducted by Mothers of Preschoolers, a thousand moms were asked what they need the most. Some of their needs included:

- Adult conversation.
- To know that I'm normal.
- Time off.
- To know that I am a good mother.
- Time with my husband.
- Time with God.
- A dishwasher that loads itself.
- Support.
- Someone who understands what I feel.
- Encouragement.
- To know that being a mother is important.

This survey turned up a number of recurring hungers many moms share:

- **Significance:** sometimes I wonder if mothering matters.
- **Growth:** sometimes I long to develop who I am.
- Intimacy: sometimes I need to be understood.
- **Help:** sometimes I need to share the load.
- **Recreation:** sometimes I need a break.

I share this to remind us that moms have needs too. Too often, the needs and hungers of moms are the last to be considered. One of the best gifts we could give to a mom is to look at the list above and pick one need we could meet. Could we affirm moms more? Could we volunteer to do the shopping or laundry more often? Could we arrange the babysitting and take mom out for a date? Could we make it a regular practice to check in with mom, giving her the opportunity to vent frustrations and share joys? Could we provide moms with a night to take a class, go out with the girls, participate in Moms Better Together (our next one is this coming Friday) or just "chill?"

Paul once wrote, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2). May we remember, today and often, that among others, the phrase "one another" includes our moms.

Sermon: O Love that Will Not Let Me Go!

God is often described as a father in Scripture, and that image/metaphor is good, useful, and powerful. Even so, God is sometimes described as a mother, as well (e.g. a mother eagle in Deuteronomy, a woman searching for a coin in Luke, a nursing mother in Isaiah). In Hosea 11, God reflects on all the devastation wrought by Israel, all the heartache God has endured in relationship to them. In the midst of (justified) righteous indignation against them, God remembers what it was like to teach little Israel to walk just like a mother would, caring for Israel as a helpless unaware baby, and God, with a mother's love, asks, "How can I give up on you?" We learn that God loves so deeply that he cannot let his people go, that he will fight to keep them. On a day that honors mothers, it's worth honoring the God who mothers all God's children so well.

If you desire for your child to grow closer to God, camp is one of the greatest assets we have in helping that become a reality. On-time prices end on June 4, so please register now!




Teen Camp 2023 "Collide"
