Sermon Series: "Envisioning Our Shared Future"

Our current sermon series reflects on the Conejo Church's vision description, which resulted from a collaborative process. Each sermon focuses on one aspect of that vision. Conejo's own Kindy De Long, in a sermon titled "Disagreeing Well," will focus on the following boldfaced portion of the statement: "The Conejo Valley Church of Christ seeks to be a thick intergenerational community of reciprocal love and grace, **embody**ing **the** Christ-centered, Spiritled character and durable unity of the church in times of harmony (Acts 2) and of discord (Acts **15)**." What can we learn from Acts 15 and other New Testament passages in which we see the early church in disagreement? How can we develop healthy, Jesuscentered practices that enable us to disagree about significant topics and yet remain a unified community that witnesses to God's love and grace?
