What's Happening At Conejo



Sermon Series: "Imagine That!"

Fear always threatens to foreclose on faith, reducing the horizons of hope and stunting what we believe is possible with God. But when we walk in faith, we seek to live out of a God-fueled imagination sustained by the world imagined in Scripture. Nurtured by the great narratives of faith, we dare to imagine a world free of slavery to Pharaoh, a God who is bigger than Goliath, and a land in which dry bones can live again. By faith, we can imagine a voiceless woman speaking up for her people before an all-powerful king, a God who can feed a legion on five loaves and two fishes, and a crucified Messiah who is resurrected from the dead. When we live with great faith, even when our knees start to shake, we trust that "the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world."

Adult Education

During May and June, our auditorium class is exploring the theme of "The Past, the Present, and the Future in Israel's Prophets." Based on passages in Amos and Hosea, we're exploring how the prophets turned Israel's gaze to the past to see how their relationship with God was established, how they observed the present to evaluate their current relationship with God, and how they envisioned the future as the fulfilling of dreams about a better relationship with God. In the process, we will engage in similar looks at our own past, present, and future as Christians in the 21st century.

Our class in the north overflow room is for those raising kids of all ages at home. The class is titled "Rooted: Growing the Next Generation Together." This class is overseen by Bill and Melissa Foster and includes time for prayer and fellowship. The class is currently taking a deep dive into Romans and Ephesians as well as a study on prayer and spiritual gifts.
