Everything I Needed to Know I Learned in Kindergarten

As our students begin a new school year of learning and discovery, and as we launch into our fall program of ministry, the insightful words of author Robert Fulghum seem especially appropriate for learners of all ages.

"All I really need to know about how to live and what to do and how to be, I learned in kindergarten. Wisdom was not at the top of the graduate-school mountain but there in the sandpile at Sunday school. These are the things I learned:

Share everything.

Play fair.

Don't hit people.

Put things back where you found them.

Clean up your own mess.

Don't take things that aren't yours.

Say you're sorry when you hurt somebody.

Wash your hands before you eat.

Flush.

Warm cookies and cold milk are good for you.

Live a balanced life—learn some and think some and draw and paint and sing and dance and play and work every day some.

Take a nap every afternoon.

When you go out into the world, watch out for traffic, hold hands, and stick together.

Be aware of wonder. Remember the little seed in the Styrofoam cup: The roots go down and the plant goes up and nobody really knows how or why, but we are all like that.

Goldfish and hamsters and white mice and even the little seed in the Styrofoam cup—they all die. So do we..."

Profound truths are often expressed in the simplest of words. May we take Fulghum's message to heart and remember that as Christians, some of the most important things we know about life and faith we learned at a very young age.

Current Sermon Series: Staying Centered in a Disjointed World

We're spending four weeks considering some of our core commitments as we practice our faith during an election season. In our third week, we'll focus on the core practice of hospitality as a reflection of Jesus' Lordship in our lives. The practice of hospitality has always been a hallmark of being a Christian. Jesus pointedly taught about the importance of caring for our neighbor, whether that neighbor was hungry, thirsty, naked, imprisoned, homeless, or the victim of a roadside mugging. His parable about who to invite to your banquet (the lame, the blind, the poor) was the opposite of the prevailing Greco-Roman customs of his day. The New Testament letters amplify Jesus' teaching concerning hospitality, challenging contemporary notions of cocooning and escaping into the security of one's "castle." Wherever we "hang our hat," part of a healthy core spirituality is to practice hospitality, which gets close to the heart of what it means to live as a Christian in today's world.
