Current Sermon Series: "The Advent Paradox"

Advent is a time of anticipation, longing, and preparation. Last week we looked at John the baptizer, the fiery prophet who prepared the way for Jesus with a message of repentance. This week, we look at Mary, who was chosen to bear the Messiah; both poor and unknown, she showed an exemplary willingness to serve God's purposes. Throughout Scripture, God often calls people whom we might judge as less-than -promising to do his work. Mary provides for us a model of openness to God's call and a powerful reminder that God works through the so-called humble and weak.

Adult Education Advent Class

During the season of Advent, our adult education program will be a combined auditorium class titled "Come Thou Long Expected Jesus." Based on the great Advent hymn by Charles Wesley, each week we'll share in an exploration of themes relating to the coming of Jesus, both as a newborn in Bethlehem and in glory at the Second Coming. This morning, Clay Smith will be reflecting on Zechariah's song of thanksgiving in Luke 1:68-79 as we think about "Israel's strength and consolation, hope of all the earth thou art."

You may not recognize their faces, but there are many hungry people in the Conejo Valley. One woman, a senior, living in Thousand Oaks, called recently and asked how she could get food from Manna. When I explained how simple it is to come and pick up food, she began to cry saying, "I should have called sooner." She is concerned about losing her home, so we were not only able to get her pantry stocked, but also put her in touch with other resources to help her during this extremely difficult time.
